His response was, "I want to hear my name." The young man goes on to explain that he feels almost like he hasn't had a name because he has never heard it. I want you to audibly speak their name right now.

How many memories flooded your mind by the simple utterance of their name? What did you see in your mind's eye? Did it transport you to another place and time? Did it cause goosebumps or bring tears to your eyes?

As I mentioned earlier, we are in the future. But if we look to the past, long before recording devices or even the written language, traditions, history and memories were passed on through the spoken word. I believe the spoken word has more power than we realize, especially with all the distraction that we have with today's technology. I'll be the first to admit that I'm guilty of choosing text messages over phone calls or even meeting others face to face. Sometimes we need to turn off the devices, gather with those we love and cherish the opportunity to talk. We should talk about those who we no longer have with us physically. When we speak their name and we speak of them something magical happens. They are still here, still with us.


